What is Camp Peaceworks?

- Camp Peaceworks, a project of Centre Safe, is a week-long summer day camp for Centre County youth ages 13-17 who are interested in social justice and change. Participants in the camp will explore important concepts around identity, justice, allyship and action. At Camp Peaceworks, we work to provide youth a space to use their voice, the opportunity to share their experiences regarding issues that matter to them, and the skills and knowledge to help them become an integral part of the solution within our community.
- By committing to this project, we acknowledge that youth have the ambition and ability to participate in making significant social change. We are aware that effecting positive change requires forming alliances—across intersections of race, gender, age, socio-economic status, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, and ability. We all bring something valuable to the table. With this in mind, we are recruiting youth of different backgrounds to take part in this collaboration. As interest in Camp Peaceworks continues to grow, we may not be able to take all campers who apply. Please know there may be a selection process as we try to extend opportunities to as many applicants as possible while also striving to create a diverse and inclusive community for the camp experience.

Camper Expectations

- Campers should have an active interest in social justice (such as gender justice, racial justice, class justice, etc.) and community change.
- Due to the personal nature of the topics discussed, we try to create a supportive space for youth to make mistakes and take chances at being vulnerable. We ask that campers be open, honest, and willing to learn. You will never be forced to share, but it will greatly enhance your experience.
- Since the themes in camp build upon each other from day to day and create a trusting environment, we ask that campers commit to attending the entire week.
- Campers are invited to attend post-camp monthly meetups and events.
- Participants completing Camp Peaceworks will be given the opportunity to apply for positions as Youth Leaders & Facilitators for future camps.

More about Camp Peaceworks

Camp Peaceworks is an exciting project of Centre Safe and its community partners, both volunteer and professional. The goal of Camp Peaceworks is to encourage young people to work together within our community to foster a multicultural society based on love, caring, and justice—with the ultimate goal of decreasing violence by creating a more inherently peaceful society.

Camp Peaceworks is based on the curriculum, "Making the Peace," by Paul Kivel and Allan Creighton, with the Oakland Men's Project. The "Making the Peace" curriculum provides the framework for understanding violence, and the roles of gender, race, class, and economic status as the issues which contribute to it. Further, the program was written to help young people break away from violence, develop positive self-esteem, and regain a sense of community.

While Camp Peaceworks begins with a five-day camp experience, it does not end there! A critical part of the project is to explore ways to meet with campers at alliance meetings or other social justice-related community events throughout the rest of the year, that will continue to build relationships with other youth and expand on the knowledge they gain in the summer. A future and continued goal of Camp Peaceworks is to find supportive ways to work with young people as they organize, use their voices, challenge policies, and work to prevent violence in their lives, schools, and in the community.
